A Third Culture Kid (TCK) is a person who has spent a significant part of his or her developmental years outside the parents' culture The TCK builds relationships to all of the cultures, while not having full ownership in any. Although elements form each culture are assimilated into the TCK's life experience, the sense of belonging is in relationship to others of similar background. (p. 19, Third Culture Kids, David C.
